History

In July, 1965, a group of interested families met to discuss the feasibility of organizing a Farmers Home Administration Water System to serve the rural areas outside Blue Ridge, Princeton and Farmersville in the northeastern section of Collin County. This forward thinking group along with the help of the Farmers Home Administration secured design expertise and financing and this plan was put into motion to form Verona Water Supply Corporation.

In May 2000 Verona Water Supply started the conversion to a Special Utility District and in May of 2002 Verona Water supply was dissolved and Verona Special Utility District was formed.

Since that time, our membership has grown to over 1200 members. We have made a very significant investment in the current and long-term planning. We currently have four wells approximately 2000 feet deep into the Woodbine Aquifer and five pumping stations to service the customers. Capital improvement and expansion projects are in progress to ensure that Verona Special Utility District stays ahead of the growth curve in North Central Texas.
